DESCRIPTION

A study of the biblical teaching on the doctrine of Christ, focussing on his being and the main aspects of his life, work, death, resurrection and continuing ministry, as well as considering some of the inadequate Christological views that have been held through the centuries.

OBJECTIVES

As a result of the student's successful participation in this module, s/he will:
